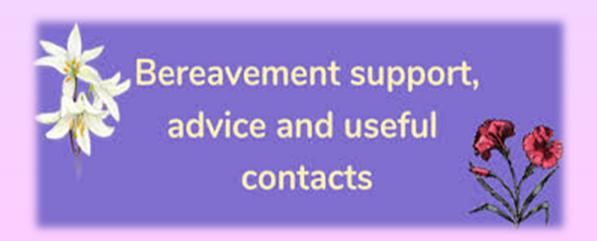


Introduction

Charlies-Angel-Centre Foundation offers many different kinds of support for bereaved parents and families.

We provide free services for anyone affected by the death of a child of any age (ranging from early miscarriage to adult children) and for any reason, including stillbirth, termination, accidental, violent or suicidal death, and death following acute or chronic Illness.

Whatever your loss we are here to support you.



About Us

We are the family of a very special angel, Charlie Arthur Curtis.

After Charlie's death, in December 2012, we found that there was little or no support available for bereaved and grieving families.

The support we received fell well below any standard a grieving family should receive. We want our experience to help improve the support systems available to other parents and families in the future.

We raise awareness of the needs of bereaved parents and families and we aim to make sure every parent leaves hospital with an after-care plan in place, which will involve midwives, Gp's and full support networks.

Charlies-Angel-Bereavement-Centre is based in Leeds and is open 7 days a week. It provides relevant information and support as well as having counsellors available throughout the day and evening.

This ensures that bereaved parents and families can access the bereavement support they need, when they need it.

How Our Services Work

Any information you require can be found either on our website or you can call us to talk through your options.

If you feel that bereavement counselling would be a benefit please complete the referral form and return to us. We aim to offer a 1st appointment within 7-10 davs.

You can self refer or ask someone to refer you e.g. GP, Friend, Key worker.

Seeking Help and Support

Bereavement effects people in different ways. Everyone's experiences and responses will be individual to them, there is no "right" or "wrong" response.

The following are some of the reactions and feelings that you may experience in the hours, days, weeks, and months after a traumatic event. It is common to experience some or all of these feelings and reactions. You may experience them immediately or some time later.

The feelings can be very strong and frightening. It can feel as if you are losing control or "going mad". These are normal reactions.

Support Groups

Our support groups are an important part of the charity, many people find it's good to mix with other people they can relate to and sometimes build friendships.

It can be frightening thinking about attending a support group, but we are here for you. On arrival at the Centre one of our volunteers will greet you and make you feel welcome.

The support groups are run on an informal basis and our aim is to make you feel comfortable and welcome, there is no pressure on anyone to talk during the session.

The groups are facilitated by the charities volunteers, many are bereaved parents or grandparents, who have all attended peer training. On some sessions one of our counsellors may attend the group. They are not there to offer counselling but bring a wealth of experience/expertise and enhance the support given.

Our Men's Corner group is run on a social basis and they will often take place away from the Centre. Activities that have taken place so far have been bowling, walks at the local park & Pool. The group decides what they would like to do at the following meeting.

All activities are free and funded by the charity.

The group is facilitated by bereaved fathers/grandfathers.

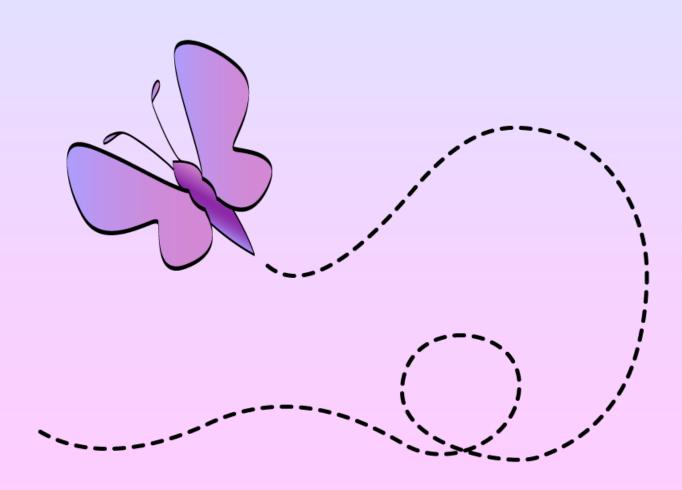
